Late Season Hunting success



To me there is nothing more thrilling and rewarding than hunting caribou during September. One of the first key to success to late hunting is choosing areas which have the type of terrain that lends itself to good late hunting. By this I mean the country needs to have mountains or rolling hills so that you are able to glass for caribou. Keep this in mind when you apply for your hunts. It goes without saying that you need to be in good physical condition to get to the top of a mountain and make this happen. On a typical day during the late season you will spend two to four hours glassing: two to three hours in the morning and the same in the afternoon and evening. When we spot the trophy caribou we move through the tundra at a slow deliberate pace we used our binoculars regularly to search for caribou.
