

Ramah Bay Hiking

In the Torngat Mountains, the forces of erosion and geology have wrought a spectacle of high Arctic austerity, extravagant rock formations and river-carved canyons. Ramah's sights are perfectly complemented with natural trailways that reveal vast valley overlooks and granite cliffs.

On your hike from Goose Lake to Adams Lake, you'll have the chance to observe Ramah Bay's arctic wildlife in their natural habitat. On the Labrador coast you'll be able to observe some distant Icebergs and a impressive amount of birds, seals and some occasional Polar bears.

Ramah Bay historical site is one of the seven Moravian missions that was built on the Labrador coast between 1771 and 1904.
