Trip Description

This very complete journey has many options available to explore Arctic Quebec's great outdoors. Every day, fly away aboard your float plane / helicopter and discover new places. Go on a fishing trip to unknown rivers and catch your dinner, fly-out on an air safari tour and make incredible discoveries, make your first animal photographic safari and live an ultimate experience in the heart of spectacular landscapes.

Your Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival at Rapid Lake/Barnoin Camp ► Upon arrival at Rapid Lake/Barnoin Camp, the manager-owner will welcome you with a cocktail, followed by emission of fishing licenses and a presentation of your upcoming itinerary. In the afternoon, you are free to fish. Dinner and overnight stay at the lodge.

Day 2: Arctic Char Fishing Excursion ► Escape for a day of fishing, flying over a magnificent tundra landscape of lakes and rivers as far as the eye can see. You'll drop down at wilderness rivers to fish for some marvellous Arctic char. For your evening meal, enjoy some of your day's catch, smoked, BBQ or sushi style. Overnight stay at the lodge.

Day 3: Air Safari and Fishing Excursion ► Fly-out on an air safari over the vast Quebec and Labrador Peninsula. Soaring over wilderness coastlines of otherworldly charm, you'll see polar bears, whales and icebergs at sea. For lunch at midday, touch down to fish and braise some of your day's catch over a wood-burning fire. Overnight stay and Labrador tea tasting at the lodge.

Day 4: Visit to the Mystifying Ghost Town of Hebron ► Fly out towards the Labrador Sea to investigate the mysteries of Hebron. En route, soar over the barren, arid Labrador Plateau to experience the eye-catching canyons and verdant valleys leading to the glorious glacial valley of Hebron. Upon arrival at Hebron Fjord Lake 5, stop to survey the grandiose fjord geography. Marvel at the remarkable rock walls and listen to the roaring waterfalls. Follow your route along the fjord to the ghost town of Hebron and admire the amazing topography of rock walls, waterfalls, rocky shores, mountains, the ocean and icebergs. Upon arrival at Hebron, absorb yourself in artefacts the Moravian missionaries left behind after coming here from Germany. Overnight stay at the lodge.

Day 5: jour: Walk with the caribou. ► Spend one day on the tundra walking with thousands of caribou. The first sight of the long processions of caribou stretching several kilometers will leave you totally amazed, and a walking safari in this exceptional place is unforgettable. In July, after a long winter, thousands of caribou return to give birth on the George River plateau. The area is well known to amateur and professional photographers in search of a subarctic wildlife photo safari. Overnight stay at the Lodge.

Day 6: Trout / Char Fishing Excursion and Adventure ► Take advantage of your last day of fishing to thoroughly enjoy the pleasure of watching your fishing line travel at top speed. In the afternoon, fly-out to fish new rivers. For your evening meal, enjoy some of your day's catch, smoked, BBQ or sushi style. Overnight stay at the lodge.

Day 7: Return trip. Lunch at the lodge.



Rapid Lake Lodge is situated in Arctic Quebec in the heart of the sub-arctic tundra, 1,400 km from Montreal and 150 km southeast of Kuujuaq. **The Barnoin River Camp** is situated in Arctic Quebec 1,500 km north of Montreal and 165 km east of Kuujuaq. Ungava Bay is located less than 40 km north of the camp.

Eight or nine weight fly rods and 300 to 350 grain sinking lines are recommended for fishing in the majority of rivers in this region.

The suggested tour is a general example and may be modified upon request. The variety of fishing grounds enables us to target the best times to fish based on the desired species. Aviation fuel service is available upon request. Bushland flights are often subject to last-minute change depending on weather conditions, in which case the itinerary will be adapted to the best possible alternative. 2.5% discount for payment by cheque.
